## REFLECTIONS FROM THE DESK OF FR. GREGORY J. HICKEY Easter Sunday

Happy Easter! This is the feast of our salvation! It is a glorious day liturgically and completes the Sacred Paschal Triduum. Some do not understand that the Church has identified the Sacred Paschal Triduum as a specific time in the Liturgical Year. This is important, since the manner in which we name our celebrations, in the liturgy, has a great impact in what people think they are about. It is important to understand the days of Holy Week and the Triduum, and when Lent ends and the Triduum begins.

Lent ends with the start of the Sacred Triduum. The celebration of the Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday is the opening, and the Triduum continues until Easter Sunday and ends with Vespers. The Triduum is actually one event or service. On Holy Thursday, there is no final blessing. Our Blessed Lord is carried to the repository for adoration and the Eucharist is reserved for Good Friday. The Passion of Our Lord is on Good Friday (Mass is not celebrated on this day) with Scripture and the reception of Holy Communion. The Easter Vigil celebrates the history of salvation, reception of the Sacraments, the renewal of Baptismal Promises, the Easter Alleluia and the Solemn Blessing at the end. It is different than the rest of the year because it is one great event. The Triduum is our high Holy Day(s) if you will in the Catholic Church.

The first day of the Triduum is from Holy Thursday evening to Good Friday. The second day is from Good Friday evening to Holy Saturday evening, and the third day is from Holy Saturday evening until Vespers on Easter Sunday evening. Easter Sunday evening begins the Octave of Easter. There are actually eight days of celebration for the great Solemnity of Easter. When we enter into the Triduum, we are entering into the three-days-in-one Liturgy that celebrates the Paschal Mystery.

The Paschal Mystery is not only about Christ's Passion, Death, and Resurrection but our participation in it. Our participation in this action of Christ is essential. We experience this each time we attend Mass, and we are to live it out in our lives outside of Mass. What is it that we live? It is no less than joining in the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross and coming to new life in Him, not because of what we do or how we strive to live the life of Christ in the world, but because of what Jesus has done for us. In other words, we do not bring Jesus into the world to make the world around us holy, we join in the action of Christ, the grace of God, already present in the world, and strive to live according to that grace because of who God is, not because of who we are. It is a subtle, but essential difference and it is in the celebration of the Triduum that we come to experience this action of Christ in its fullest.

May each of you come to know the great love that Jesus has for each of you and may Easter bring you and your family the Lord's blessing. I would like to personally thank all those who participated in the Sacred Triduum this year in all the various ministries. My personal gratitude is extended to Mrs. Kathy Kulp and the choir for the beautiful music and to Bonnie Stankunas and Joseph Harbach who are our organists. I would also like to thank Maryann Dailey and Bill Gatta who are our cantors for the weekend and enhance our Liturgy by leading us in song. Thank you to each of you who have attended Mass so faithfully during the Lenten Season. We welcome each of you today to the beautiful Easter Liturgy and extend a warm welcome to our visitors. I would also like to thank the many parishioners who donated money for our beautiful Easter flowers which are adorning our sanctuary this Easter. This was coordinated by Diana Gulotta and her team who work so hard to provide their creativity in ordering and arranging the flowers for our church. Our Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, our Lectors, Servers, Greeters, and Ushers do a wonderful job every week and they are deeply appreciated. Finally, I would like to thank Maria Boyer, our Director of Religious Education, who along with Mrs. Lori Carr were the facilitators for our RCIA Program this year.

I would like to congratulate Mr. James Reitz who was baptized, confirmed, and received First Holy Communion last night at the Easter Vigil and to thank his sponsors, Tom and Cathy Reilly for their support during his journey to the faith.

Next weekend, we will welcome Mrs. Nicole Griffin into full communion in the Catholic Church. Nicole will make a Profession of Faith, be confirmed and receive First Holy Communion. Nicole was baptized into the Episcopalian Church and does not have to be re-baptized. Her sponsor is Mrs. Maria Boyer.

Finally, we remember all of the families who have lost a loved one this year. May the Risen Lord fill their hearts with the love of the Lord and may their loved ones rest in peace with the Lord.
