#### REFLECTIONS FROM THE DESK OF FR. GREGORY J. HICKEY

I am holding a pocket watch in my hand as I write this article and I have had the privilege of having this watch for approximately 13 years. It belonged to my Mother's Dad, my Grandfather, whom I never had the pleasure of meeting. I have heard about him from Mom and my aunts and uncles, who have all pre-deceased my Mom who was the youngest. I was particularly close to my Mother's Mother growing up and spent many weekends with her in Darby, PA. She was a wonderful cook as well as a baker and she told me about my Grandfather also. She loved each of us and taught us many lessons about life and how to treat people. The watch was given to Mom when she was a young girl to always remember her Dad. It was one of Mom's prized possessions and that is why I feel so honored that she gave it to me.

When Mom was just ten years old, there was a fire in her home and my Grandfather died in the fire and she witnessed his death. The family had to jump from the second floor. My Grandfather actually went to save one of my uncles who was a milk man and he thought he was asleep on the couch but it turned out that Uncle Dick was not home yet. Gramps was consumed with the smoke and fire and passed away that evening. It was a terrible tragedy for Mom and her whole family and Gran gave her the pocket watch when she was a teenager as one of the keepsakes that was not destroyed in the fire.

As I am looking at the watch, I feel that Gramps had it with him in the building business, when he held his children for the first time, and when he held Gran's hand. He was just 66 when he died and the pocket watch is almost like a relic for me. It holds many memories and I wish that I had the opportunity to know him.

We have relics in the Church as well because people need a tangible link to the past and that link transforms the past into the present. When we come into contact with an object, our minds and hearts are flooded with memories, stories, and emotions. Consider how many people who are in love keep a photo of the person they love. The loved ones could be on the other side of the world, but that photo makes them feel close and reminds them of the person they love. Because the memory is kept alive, it affects how a person acts. People want to behave in a way that will continue to honor the relationship they have.

One might say that relics are just material objects that don't do anything; they have no magical abilities. However, what they represent profoundly affects us. It is like an autograph from a famous person. The autograph actually is just ink on paper. It serves as a reminder of the person who signed it, and for a brief moment you were in that individual's presence.

Relics call to mind the lives of the saints. They help us to remember the stories of the past and build upon those stories for the future. The relics of the saints remind us that we are always in the presence of a great cloud of witnesses who intercede for us, encourage us, and assist us. The relics do not bring the saints closer to us. Instead, they help us to grow closer to the saints. We feel connected to the men and women who have been witnesses to the faith. We aspire to be more like them and feel compelled to give our lives as a testimony to the faith we profess.

Every time I look at Gramps' pocket watch or have it in my pocket, I know that I aspire to make him proud of me. I know that I honor his memory by how I live my life each day. The pocket watch carries with it traditions and memories that live on through my life and help me to be the best man and priest that I can be. Someday I will hopefully meet him in heaven and will have a grand reunion and catch up on all the years I missed.

Grandparents and Parents, do not forget to hug your children and tell them how much you love them. They will never forget it.

This Wednesday is rather unique. It is Valentine's Day as well as Ash Wednesday and the beginning of Lent. Mass will be celebrated in Church at 9:00 a.m. as well as 7:00 p.m. Ashes will be imposed on your foreheads at both Masses.
