It was rather sudden and quite surprising. It was also inspiring to say the least. An acquaintance was sitting across from me recently at the table in a diner where a group of us gather on a regular basis. Our breakfast coffee klatch is a time to relax, catch-up, and deepen our friendships as we solve all the problems of our nation, world, and Church in a usually very lively - and sometimes very heated - conversation. This day was



different. As I took my seat at the table, Eileen pulled out a stack of books from a plastic shopping bag. She made a very quiet and stunning revelation. I'm a writer, she whispered. What? I leaned towards her. It was hard to hear over the diner noise. I'm a writer, she repeated, these are some of my books. Your books? What? Wow! It was hard to believe. Why hadn't she ever said anything? Eileen is one of

the more quiet individuals among us. She admitted that she is the more quiet type and that she didn't want

to "show-off." Writers tend to be quiet, she said. I don't know about that. But, at any rate, on this particular day, she felt that it was time for her to reveal her work and her talent. In doing this, she was also revealing her faith. She was revealing her true self. Most of the books that she has authored or edited are about our own dear Padre Pio. I asked her if she has ever been to his Shrine in Barto. Of course, she had. I made her aware that I'm only about twenty minutes away. Next time you go, we'll have to meet. One of the other ladies present immediately chimed in saying that they'll have to make plans for a little



pilgrimage. Her writings have been published by such well respected organizations as Our Sunday Visitor and Pauline Books and Media (The Daughters of St. Paul). She has also published a work for middle school students on Molly Pitcher and the story of her heroic actions at the Battle of Monmouth in the hot June of 1778. Eileen studied at Lock Haven University and used to teach writing at the Institute of Children's Literature. She told me that Padre Pio is her dear friend. It was he, along with her children that brought her back to the Faith lost after her husband's death. Her writings are reflective of her own journey. She is so happy now to be able to share Faith with others — and that day at the diner, she simply felt that it was time to reveal and share it with



us. There will be a rather quiet revelation come the end of this week. In the Three Great Days that we know as the Sacred Triduum, Jesus will reveal Who He truly is as the very Son of God when He quietly emerges from a tomb. Dismayed and doubting disciples will be overwhelmed as they stand before that same empty tomb. Then, they will initially be at a loss for words as they lay eyes upon Him once again. Fear will give way to Faith; sadness

to Joy. No longer being able to contain themselves, they will then speak and teach and some will write. Holy Week is an opportunity for all of us to rediscover our Faith. Though perhaps lost in the sufferings and sorrows of our own Good Fridays, it is found ever anew in encountering the Risen Jesus. Rediscover Faith this Holy Week. As the Lord reveals His True Self, Risen in Glory, He reveals to you and to me our true selves. Now like any good writer, it's time for us to tell our story!

Further, All persons 18 years of age and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Good Friday, while the other two meals are to light.


