

Did you see it? The solar eclipse of the eighth of April 2024 is now behind us. I had my special glasses for viewing courtesy of the National Science Foundation and an ever kind Parish Administrative Assistant. Thanks, Kathy! I thought



that it might be a bit too cloudy here last Monday, but that was not the case. At about 3:20 pm or so, we stood in the parking lot looking skyward. It was rather cool to view that thin sliver of sun – the rest being blackened by the moon. The moment quickly passed. I mused on how many thousands of others must be staring skyward at the exact same moment. I know a young couple that traveled to the



Buffalo/Rochester area of New York State just to be able to witness the eclipse in totality. I had such an experience once in my life. I didn't travel just to see the eclipse, but I happened to be vacationing in the area where the total eclipse took place. Fortunately, it was a brilliantly clear and sunny day. The effects of the eclipse would be even more pronounced. It was visible over Southern Germany in August of 1999. The German acronym



for it was Sofi99. It got as much press there at the time as April 8th did here this year. I

remember some people were planning parties around the event. I was in the countryside at the time in an open field. We didn't have special glasses, but we did have a properly shaded welder's helmet which served the same purpose. As the sun darkened, the sky took on a most unusual, murky color with brightness visible on the horizon. The animals all acted strangely. They



seemed bewildered. Birds in the sky started chirping frantically and dogs seemed to be in a panic. The moment passed quickly and soon enough, we were bathed in bright sunshine once again. It is little wonder that ancient peoples developed myths and legends around such an event. Often it was interpreted as a message from the gods. Maybe, it is. That message today wouldn't be from some gods, but from *The* God. And it wouldn't be a



message of wrath and displeasure as it was often viewed in ancient times, but one of a heavenly beauty and a universe most vast. Someone remarked how interesting that a brief darkening of the sun as the moon passes by draws so much attention throughout the world, but the brilliant Glory of God shining forth

everyday in our Churches goes unnoticed. The Most Holy Eucharist is the very Glory of God. It is the Risen Son shining forth. Our



call is not just to look upon Him, but to actually receive Him. Eucharistic Adoration is a devotion meant to inflame that desire to receive and ultimately to become what we worship. Wow! How awesome is that? The solar event that happened on April 8th is now behind us; the Solar Event that is the Glory of God is on-going and everyday in our Church. Come once again and catch a glimpse! Consider inviting a friend and know that special glasses for viewing are never needed, but merely eyes of Faith!
