
American **Red Cross**

Maybe it's just me. But it seems to take me a while to "wake-up" in the morning. Oh, my eyes are open and I'm

breathing...thank God! But my mind can seem to be in a fog, lingering in that last wee bit



of nocturnal bliss for like a half-hour or more. Dreaming ends as it crashes with reality. I need that first cup of java, then maybe a second. I need to go before the Lord apologetically with only one eye open and my brain not quite functioning as I begin what seems more like pleading than prayer: Good morning, Lord! Help me this day! Help me to wake-up!



Maybe, just maybe, this is essentially what prayer is: waking from a very sound, if not



necessarily restful slumber; waking to reality; waking to *the* Reality that is our Faith; the Reality that is Christ the New Day. I remember someone in the seminary that had a particular habit. He spoke of it proudly. Although later ordained a priest, unfortunately he no longer is. He had a particular discipline in the morning. Discipline is a good thing. I don't mean discipline in the sense

of detention after school, but the discipline needed to train for a marathon or even a 5k race; the discipline needed in going to the gym on a regular basis, which I know that so many do. Such discipline is a good thing and not the result of some bad behavior like that time in school. This particular seminarian's discipline had to do with his rising in the morning. He said that he would rise and get out of bed at the



sound of the alarm clock. He said that he would rise immediately. For him, there was no "hitting the snooze bar" or "just five more minutes, mom." No, he would forgo such earthly

inclination and immediately arise. How impressive! How disciplined! I could never do such a thing. I still don't seem



to be able. In fact, often I just want to stay in bed, slothful soul that I am apparently. But as I said, unfortunately, he is no longer serving and saying Mass. I am. I wonder if his discipline had anything to do with it. I mean, even Our Lord was three days in the tomb. Divinity indeed rises immediately. It would seem that it is our lowly humanity that does not. We have various seasons throughout our whole Church Year every year. Now, we are in this Season

of Easter awaiting Ascension and Pentecost. Wasn't all of Lent and Easter Week enough? The answer is "no." They're not. All of us need time to awaken and arise...some more than others. We need this "time" to "wake-up" and clear the "fog," so to speak. I enjoy that necessary cup of coffee or tea in the morning as I try to focus anew pleading as praying and praying as pleading. Lord, help us to face reality as we arise and



awaken to You – and in You! Such a Reality of Resurrection is hard to fathom humanly speaking and oftentimes, we'd just rather stay in bed and sleep. Apparently, that's okay and that's quite normal. It usually takes awhile to be fully awake. In this Easter Season, have a cup of "morning Joe" – or two. Then watch the Glorious Son arise on a New Day. Take your time – and wake-up!
