First, it was a former parishioner and friend. That was back in the fall. Right before Holy Week and Easter, it was a grade

school friend that had just moved back into the area. Now, most recently, it was my good friend and "Kumpel" – Mike. Dying suddenly and unexpectedly has sadly struck close to home for me of late. Roger was just shy of sixty. We ran road races together in the past. We were very proud of our Broad Street Runs, but enjoyed most being out with the parish XC and track teams during practice. Rich has lived out in Arizona for years, but always stayed in touch. In






his words, he got "tired of the heat" and was happy to report that he and his sister would be moving back east to Camp Hill in the

Harrisburg area. Since a mutual friend of ours already lives out that way, "the old gang will soon be back together," he had said. Unfortunately, that reunion wouldn't last long. Losing

a good friend is never easy, but perhaps Michael's death is the most difficult. That is because of the circumstances. Mike wasn't yet forty. He leaves







in the annual "beer bowl" that he and his friends held every year on Super Bowl Sunday. This "old guy" didn't do too bad playing with

those young bucks on that particular Super Bowl Sunday. At least he didn't break any of his bones and the few scrapes were well worth it. That was the year the Eagles won and watching the game in the wee hours that year with those Bavarian football

fans was especially sweet, because I was the only one sporting an Eagles' jersey. Unfortunately, Mike rooted for and was always a fan of New England. I let him know that

I was constantly praying for his conversion. Well, it could have been worse. He could have been rooting for that *other* team from somewhere in Texas. I'm sure that he won't be surprised to find Our Lord sporting a jersey with a #1 on it, though the fact that it's green and bears the letters *H-u-r-t-s* on the back might startle him. All three of these guys were good friends and good people. They were all men of Faith. I was privileged to preside at the Funeral Mass for both Roger and Rich. That's what makes Mike's death all the more difficult.





Being an ocean away means that, I cannot be present with his wife and

family now in their grief nor preside at his Funeral. This is where the true privilege of priesthood comes in and the honor of being a pastor – *your* pastor. As a priest, I can offer Mass for Mike from anywhere and I can never be closer with him now than when I celebrate Mass – any Mass. And therein is my main consolation with the passing of Mike, my other friends, my parents, and other family members as well. They are always present with me at Mass as are all our deceased loved ones – more present than we can imagine. My other consolation is *you* – in your prayers offered and condolences given. I am greatly appreciative. It's what being a part of a parish family is all about. Easter is the Season of New Life and Resurrection. Jesus *did* rise. This is our ultimate hope and consolation that overcomes all sadness bringing us all together as friends of Christ! Alleluia!

He is Risen! See you at Mass, Mike!
