The annual Clergy Convocation is a time to gather with brother priests and the archbishop. It is a time of

fraternity and mutual support. There are a number of presentations, discussions, and, of course, shared meals. This year's gathering took place down the shore in Cape May and its theme centered on the topic of our current and (hopefully) on-going Revival of that which is the "Source and Summit" of everything that we do as Church. Many

are not sure or have forgotten what that oh so important "Source and Summit" is and thus, the reason for a Revival

and our conference theme. Now getting to Cape May from here is a bit like *Gilligan's Island*. It's a three hour tour. *Aarrgh!* One can save time by using the expressway, but I wanted to relax taking the scenic route, i.e., the back roads.

The ride down was long, but uneventful. The Skipper would have been pleased. The return trip was a different story little buddy.

Remember the old days and paper maps? Now, we rely on GPS and a voice that tells you where to turn and approximates very closely your ETA. GPS uses satellite technology and algorithms. I think I broke the algorithm. On the ride down, I followed "her" directions exactly, because I wasn't quite sure of my way and I wanted to arrive on time. Although, programmed for "no tolls or highways," my GPS girl wound-up taking me





on a highway route for a time. Apparently, algorithms are set with the quickest route...even the "quickest" back roads. I realized this on my return trip when I had a better idea of the route that I wanted to take. Miss Algorithm was simply beside herself. *Recalculating...recalculating.* At one point, she had me looping up around Newark and then back down to South Jersey. I wasn't lost..."she" was! It's not *always* about the shortest route,

nor is it about going some two hundred miles out of one's way like some reenactment of the desert wandering! That's soooo Lent! But now, it's Easter! And Easter is about the journey of Resurrection that now begins. Despite drivers that might be on your bumper for some twenty miles, despite birds blocking the roadway and state troopers that come *this close* to pulling you over, the journey is well worth it, because at the end, finally, you arrive home! That's when *aarrgh* becomes *aaahhh* and the bottle of wine gets uncorked. The same is true for us as Church. We need to break the



algorithm, slow down just a bit, and go a different route – just as Jesus, Himself, did. The Easter Season now begins. Be sure to slow down just a bit and take the most Scenic Route of Resurrection!
