Maranatha! As we prepare to soon say Merry Christmas, we would do well to have another phrase upon our lips and




even more so in our hearts. Maranatha is a transliteration of the Greek expression which is in turn a transliteration of the Aramaic expression. This transliteration occurs only once in the New




Testament at the end of Saint Paul's Letter to the Corinthians (1 Corinthians 16:22). It also appears in the Didache, which is an anonymous early Christian writing of great import. It expresses a longing for the coming of Our Lord. We might express it in English as Come, Lord Jesus, come! The Catechism of the Catholic Church translates it as simply Come, Lord!

It appears that is was a prayer and a greeting in the early Church. What a wonderful tradition it would be to recover! Although the expression spoken in English is fine consider how much better to have words upon our lips in the language that Jesus Himself spoke. A part of our



Christian tradition is to have short prayers at the ready hurling them towards God like javelins so to speak. Some might call them "prayer darts." Most of us are familiar with these. There are



Maranatha, as the ideal "prayer dart" that has a

harmonic quality which soothes, calms, and brings the mind to silence. During this Season of Advent, I sometimes offer this phrase to penitents as their penance to be recited simply and slowly several times: Maranatha, Come Lord Jesus! I believe that it can set a tone and prepare the heart for Christ's coming at Christmas. It need not be just a penance given! All of us are now preparing for Christ's coming during



Advent, this Christmas, and beyond. As we do so, hopefully we can have an ancient Christian prayer upon our lips in the language that Jesus Himself spoke. Maranatha! Come Lord Jesus, come!
