Back at camp, I washed up and began to

eat some. Suddenly, I had a funny, warm feeling. Then, I wasn't feeling too well at all. I felt like I might vomit. Then, I did. This cute kid's beautiful, youthful olive skin began to itch becoming

bumpy and red. My whole body became lumpy and bumpy, itchy and red. I began to look like Frankenstein! The rest of camp was awful! Now, I was the icky one! Although I still love the woods and hiking, to this day I'm not overly enamored with camping and I definitely still





have a fear of raspberries...everything from wild raspberries to raspberry flavored anything! I think back to that weekend at a Girl Scout Camp with my aunt and the icky little Frankenstein that I had become. Fear can be a great motivator. Psychologists know all about the notion of "fight or flight" that is rooted in it. Fear motivates many today. Almost all of the problems in our world seem due to it. We fear that which is different. We fear the other. We fear opinions that are not our own. We fear giving witness to our beliefs. We fear loss — of power, pride, wealth, or position. We fear loss against our opponents — especially if they happen to

be from a certain football loving city in Texas...or even some tiny little town in Judea! If only we could overcome all our fears! Advent *is* a time to overcome fear – whatever those fears may be. God, Himself, demonstrates this in lowering Himself fearlessly and coming among us as a man – a man that many, for all of the above reasons, would begin to fear. But fear would be overcome for good on a future Friday afternoon. It is the Love that is our Faith that overcomes all fear in the end. Get ready! That same Love will lie so soon innocent in a manger. Go to the manger! There one will discover something – a Child, a Son, and a Savior. There one will discover



Love itself in the form of a Little Child. His is a Love that, in the end, overcomes **all** fear! Just don't offer the poor kid any wild raspberries!
