the sideline catching a smoke while drinking a cold one. *Cancel the ambulance! He's breathing! It's a miracle!* I think my prayers might have helped! After the game, we enjoyed our American lunch of hamburgers, hot dogs, and fries. The "Super Bowl" trophy was then awarded to the winning team for that year. In reality, we were all winners that day. After lunch, because of the time difference, everyone was able to head home to wash-up, freshenup, and take a bit of a needed respite. The actual Super Bowl game would begin at 12:30 in the morning. The Eagles spectacular win in those wee hours was just delicious icing on the

cake. The fact that I was the only one there sporting an Eagles's jersey while sitting between two New England fans made the Bird's victory even sweeter. Super Bowl Sunday is a day rather unique isn't it? Family and friends get together and celebrate. It's what every Sunday is really supposed to be. It is a day on which



we forget divisions, animosities, and even politics for a time, because there is a focus on Something Greater. Super Bowl Sunday is about the love of a game and sport. It is about family, fun, and friendship. It is about new friendships made and old ones rekindled. Every Sunday is our "Super Bowl" Sunday as Church. We have our Traditions as we gather as family
