A Short History of St. Gabriel of the Sorrowful Mother Church (Celebrating the Feast Day of our Patron Saint on Sunday, February 27.)

Before the founding of their parish, the Catholics in Stowe attended Mass either at St. Aloysius Church or Holy

Trinity Church in Pottstown. Beginning in 1926 Sunday Mass was celebrated in a private home, that of the late James Bucciaglia. This made it possible for people to attend Mass in Stowe instead of traveling to Pottstown. Father Wachter, rector of St. Aloysius Church, came to Stowe every Sunday to celebrate Mass and administer the Sacraments. Later the rector of



Immaculate Conception Church in Birdsboro, Reverend James Gibbons ministered to the flock. Mass was celebrated in the private home for about eighteen months. Then, due

to lack of space, the congregation celebrated Mass in the West End Fire Company. As the community grew, the people petitioned the Archbishop that a new parish be formed and a rector appointed. Consequently, on June 16, 1929 the parish of St. Gabriel was formed and Reverend Francis M. Conroy was appointed as first pastor. Since no parish buildings existed at the time, Father

Conroy lived at the Birdsboro rectory for a while, then in the Flannery home in Douglassville. The parishioners, proud of their new status, realized that their work was just beginning. A committee was organized for the

purpose of purchasing property on which to build the church and rectory. Some committee members also belonged to St. Gabriel Lodge, a social organization established by the Italian immigrants who wished to preserve their cultural heritage. They succeeded in convincing the Lodge to donate a part of their property to the parish. The Church was built in the latter part of 1930 by the Circle-A-Corporation of Indiana at a cost of \$8,500.00 with a



seating capacity of 225. The rectory, located at Howard and Jefferson Streets, was completed that same year. It was under the

capable administration of Father Suchanek, second pastor of St. Gabriel Church, that the present church, school and first convent were constructed. Ground was broken for the construction of the new church on August 6, 1961, and dedication came more than a year later, when Most Reverend J. Carroll McCormick, Auxiliary Bishop of Philadelphia, solemnly blessed the church on September 2, 1962. The new church currently has a seating capacity of 580.

The new church contains a Sanctuary, Narthex, Confessional, Priest's Sacristy, Altar Server's Sacristy, Work Room, Choir Gallery and Social Hall with kitchen facilities. The stained glass windows depict the fifteen Mysteries of the Rosary, four events in the life of Our Lord as recorded in the New Testament, and one of our Patron, St. Gabriel of the Sorrowful Mother.
