ADMINISTRATOR'S COLUMN

First, a calendar reminder: don't forget that Saturday is the celebration of our Parish Feast Day. There will be a Mass for the Feast Day at 9:00 am.

Lent has begun! As we make this journey over the next six weeks, we're all asked by the Church to reflect on our lives and to find ways to turn from worldly and sinful inclinations and turn back to the Lord though Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. We try to find increased opportunities for prayer. We fast from food and other good things to discipline ourselves, ridding ourselves of our attachment to earthly things to focus more on the things of Heaven. And we engage in works of mercy and charity so that we can use the good things that we have been given to benefit others.

With regard to that last category, almsgiving, we of course have our parish collection of items going to support the homeless being sheltered over to at St. Aloysius parish. Some people have already commented about that outreach and were very glad to see that we are helping in that effort. We are also, as usual, participating in Operation Rice Bowl, by which parishioners are asked to support efforts to feed the hungry. One way this can be done is by saving your change in the bowl every time you spend cash, which can accumulate nicely over Lent. Nowadays, many of us aren't using cash the way we used to, which means less spare change. One suggestion for the Rice Bowl is to have a simple meal as a family and donate the money that would have been spent on something more elaborate and expensive to help the poor. I'm sure you can be creative and find other ways as well.

Another important charity that needs to be highlighted is the Catholic Charities Appeal of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. This appeal is used to provide funding for a number of ministries and programs within the Archdiocese, including programs of Special Education, Social Service agencies, Child Nutrition programs, Housing and Homeless Services, Foster Care services, programs and support for persons with disabilities, care for elderly and retired priests, and more. The Catholic Charities Appeal is the single largest fundraising effort in the Archdiocese. Our parish was given a goal to raise \$12,000 for the appeal. As of my writing this, we have raised \$7,600 toward that goal, with 70 families participating. Can we do better than that? More information about the Catholic Charities Appeal, including a video and information on how to donate, can be found on our website. Thank you for your generosity!

On other Lenten suggestion. Instead of watching TV or a movie, use that entertainment time for something that can be a bit educational and help you learn something more about our faith. Our parish now has a subscription to Formed.org — an online treasure trove of educational and formative videos. You can find movies about the lives of saints, different series that will help you study the bible, even cartoons for children (and those adults who are still children at heart). The parish has purchased a subscription for all our parishioners, so there is no cost to you. If you're like me and find yourself frustrated because you can't find anything interesting in the TV listings, take a look at some of the content on Formed for something different. For more information on how to sign up, check out our website.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 21

First Reading - Genesis 9:8-15

God said to Noah and to his sons with him: "See, I am now establishing my covenant with you and your descendants after you and with every living creature that was with you: all the birds, and the various tame and wild animals that were with you and came out of the ark. I will establish my covenant with you, that never again shall all bodily creatures be destroyed by the waters of a flood; there shall not be another flood to devastate the earth." God added: "This is the sign that I am giving for all ages to come, of the covenant between me and you and every living creature with you: I set my bow in the clouds to serve as a sign of the covenant between me and the earth. When I bring clouds over the earth, and the bow appears in the clouds, I will recall the covenant I have made between me and you and all living beings, so that the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all mortal beings."

Responsorial Psalm

Second Reading - 1 Peter 3:18-22

Beloved: Christ suffered for sins once, the righteous for the sake of the unrighteous, that he might lead you to God. Put to death in the flesh, he was brought to life in the Spirit. In it he also went to preach to the spirits in prison, who had once been disobedient while God patiently waited in the days of Noah during the building of the ark, in which a few persons, eight in all, were saved through water. This prefigured baptism, which saves you now. It is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers subject to him.

Gospel - Mark 1:12-15

The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: "This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel."

Minimum Obligations for Fasting: Fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday for ages 18 to 59 - Fasting is defined as one main meal and two smaller meals with no food in between. Abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent for ages 14 and up.

Other ideas for Fasting - Find a personal sacrifice that will be meaningful to you and help you on your own spiritual journey. Check out resources on Formed.org instead of watching TV or movies.

Sacrament of Penance/Confession - Sundays from 8:00-8:45 AM. Wednesdays from 6:00-6:45 PM. Saturdays from 3:00 -3:45 PM.

Eucharistic Adoration - Wednesdays from 9:30 AM to 7:00 PM.

Stations of the Cross - Wednesdays at 7:0 PM and Fridays at 1:00 PM.

Operation Rice Bowl - Provide food for the hungry by donating spare change or making a cash donation to Operation Rice Bowl. Rice Bowls are in the vestibule of church.

Lenten Homeless Outreach - Support the local interfaith homeless community outreach from February 17 through March 28. Parish collection of "basics" will be collected in the Church vestibule. Donations will be given to Al's Heart Warming Center, run by Pottstown LIFT. Items most needed are: disposable food service gloves, N95 or KN95 masks, paper towels, underwear - men's and women's sizes M-XL, Leggings/base layer/thermals/ men's and women's sizes M-XL, tampons, gloves, non-perishable snacks (the healthier the better).
