# REFLECTIONS FROM THE DESK OF FR. GREGORY J. HICKEY Medical Update

Tuesday was an historic day in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. We bid farewell to Archbishop Chaput who was our Archbishop for 8.5 years and we said hello to Archbishop Nelson Perez. I hope you got a chance to watch his installation on television. Fr. Ortega and I watched it Tuesday. You can view it if you go to Cbsphilly.com and it is on the CBS website. The Mass was very well attended and the morale was terrific as well as the various types of music. There were some very touching moments within the celebration. A new era has occurred and it is very positive.

I have know Archbishop Perez for many years. He is warm, energetic, very personable, intelligent, and just the type of Archbishop that the archdiocese needs at this time in our history. When you are in his presence, it's like you are the only person in the world and you feel that you have known him for years. He reaches out to all people and has a particular charisma to energize the youth in every diocese he has served. I feel confident that he will do the same here.

His appointment is unique in that it is extremely rare that a bishop would be appointed to a diocese that he was ordained from and served as a priest. Archbishop Perez knows the archdiocese well and has served here for many years and in many capacities. I know he will do a wonderful job here as Archbishop of Philadelphia and will bring people back to the Church with his warmth and outgoing personality.

I want to thank you for all your prayers and notes and phone calls, texts, and emails with my latest fall. On January 17<sup>th</sup>, I was coming home from Mishock Physical Therapy in Gilbertsville. I parked the car in the breeze way and went up the two steps and then opened the back door and was going up the final step to get into the house, and my right leg just did not have the strength to get up that last step and the leg gave out and I fell backwards and hit my head on the cement and heard my back crack. It was five o'clock and no one was around. I was there for about 45 minutes and a man walking his dog found me and called 911. I was taken to Pottstown Emergency Room where they took many tests and ascertained that nothing was broken. It was a miracle in itself that there was no concussion or broken back but there was internal bruising. I stayed in the hospital for five days and as one of my doctors said, "You have nine lives and we are shocked that nothing was broken." They thought as well as the Archdiocese that my retirement would have to be moved up.

I am happy to report that I am doing much better and I had intensive Physical Therapy at home and did many strengthening exercises at home and was discharged from home health and am now back at Mishock in Gilbertsville. I will be returning to the Chapel for daily Mass on Monday of next week and will be back to weekend Masses on February 29<sup>th</sup> and Fr. Ortega and I will continue to rotate the weekend Masses.

I have made such good progress that I will be here until June and will retire at the regular time when the priest changes come out so I am grateful for that. I have been in touch with the Villa in Darby and one of their nurses came out and did a physical assessment and medical history and barring no other falls, I will be here until June.

I am very grateful to Fr. Ortega who has lived here since this latest fall and has celebrated all of the Masses, has gone shopping, cooked many meals, and has taken me on several excursions and has been a real brother to me.

Thank you again for your prayers. Keep them coming. I still need them. I pray for each of you daily.

## FAST & ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE

**FOR LENT** - The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

All are encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl which has aided countless hungry persons here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and our world. Operation Rice Bowl boxes are at the entrances to church for your donations. Also, Operation Rice Bowls are at the entrances for your homes.
