Sometimes I falter at first. Call it a natural nervousness. It sometimes leads to my giving up or others giving up on me. There was the golf team try-out in high school. It's not that I couldn't play golf. I had

been playing since early grade school, but I never had to "try-out." I never had to "prove" myself before others, so I was nervous to say the least. A kid with whom I went through grade school, also tried-out. Tusky was even shorter than I was, but was much taller in his confidence. He also belonged to the local country club, whereas I didn't. I'm sure that helped. Tusky made the team. I did not. I think that my father was more dejected



than I was. I felt a certain sense of relief. At least I wouldn't have to try to "outperform" Tusky on the course each week. Some of us, perhaps, just need a chance to grow comfortable and grow in confidence. My grand Spelling Bee foray in grade school is another example. Tusky never even made



that team. Unfortunately, being nervous on stage and in front of an audience, I tripped over the very first word and was disqualified. My father hadn't even gotten into the school auditorium yet after parking the car. Wondering why I didn't seem to be participating, my mother finally had to explain to my incredulous father. What?!? He's out already?!? It's not like I couldn't spell. The seminary is another story of "faltering." Obviously, I wasn't "disqualified." However, I did need

a good bit of time to accept being accepted. My rather patient spiritual director very much seemed to understand - but my pastor, at the time, not so much. I guess he was more of a *just-do-it* type of guy. Nevertheless, he told me to simply keep the cassocks and breviary that he had presented to me

quite confident that I would indeed soon enough be making use of them. There are some folks who simply exude confidence. They appear readily comfortable in just about any situation. I'm not among them. The reality is that over-confidence can be a fault, too, just as its lack can be. We see this among all those that the Lord has chosen. We see this





among the Twelve. Jesus knows us better than we know ourselves.

Sometimes it's a matter of being humbled with proud Peter or at other times, ever encouraged with the youthful John. Lent is a time of having confidence tempered as suits our individual needs. It is a time to overcome that which we lack in order to join and become part of a team. The Coach wants each one of us, because He knows

already, that each one of us have something of great value to contribute leading in the end to that one putt "gimme" on the green and a Championship won come Easter Sunday morning!
