ADMINISTRATOR'S COLUMN

As I'm writing this, snow has been falling for quite some time, and it's really piling up. The decision was made late Monday to move the 9am Tuesday Mass to 4pm, hoping some people might be able to dig out and attend by that point. Communicating the change was a challenge, but a few phone calls to the "regulars" and an email blast hopefully got the message out to as many people as possible. Fortunately, we are a smaller community, so it didn't take a ton of effort. I know of some parishes that have had to outright cancel Masses recently because the priests were exposed to Covid. Some of these changes happened at the last minute. Getting the word out about that must have been even more difficult, and I wouldn't be surprised if people showed up on a Sunday expecting there to be Mass and had to go home disappointed or find another parish.

Emergency schedules and cancellations like this require quick communication so I'll make another plug to ask for everyone to sign up for Flocknote. Information on how to sign up is on our website (stgabrielstowepa.org). The system allows us to reach you quickly by e-mail and/or text message. You don't need to be a parishioner to sign up; if you're reading this, then you have enough of a connection to the parish that you should sign up to keep informed!

We are a week and a half away from the start of Lent! Ash Wednesday is going to look a little different this year. More information on that next week. There is an insert in the bulletin this week that gives an overview of some opportunities in the parish to help in your observance of Lent. A few highlights:

- We are extending Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 7:00 pm on Wednesdays. We still need people to sign up to pray in church, so please call the office if you can help out.
- There are two additional opportunities for Confession each week: Wednesdays at 6:00 pm and Sundays at 8:00 am.
- Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Wednesday evenings at 7:00 and Friday afternoons at 1:00. Hopefully you can join us.
- We are engaging in a parish-wide outreach to help the local homeless community. A group of local churches runs a program that provides shelter for the homeless during the winter months. As a parish, we are looking to collect some basic essentials for their benefit: toiletries, socks, undergarments, gloves, hats, etc. Our PREP students will be joining in by assembling laundry kits – and having a little inter-class competition as they do. More info to follow.

To help you in your Lenten journey, we are making available some Lenten devotional books. We have some copies of both *The Word Among Us* and the *Magnificat* Lenten books. Both provide you with daily readings and a brief reflection point for each day. We will have them in the back of the church next weekend. The parish has purchased these for your benefit; please take one. At the same time, we do not have an unlimited supply, so please only take one if you're actually going to use it, and please limit yourself to one book or another so we can ensure everyone has a chance to get them. (Donations to help pay for the books are, of course, welcome but not necessary.)

I mentioned a couple weeks ago that the parish was getting a subscription to Formed.org. That's been set up, and we got a nice discount for the first year to boot! There is no cost to you to have access to all the material they offer. For more information on Formed, including how to sign up, please check out our website and look to future bulletins.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 7

First Reading - Job 7:1-4, 6-7

Job spoke saying: Is not man's life on earth a drudgery? Are not his days those of hirelings? He is a slave who longs for the shade, a hireling who waits for his wages. So I have been assigned months of misery, and troubled nights have been allotted to me. If in bed I say, "When shall I arise?" then the night drags on; I am filled with restlessness until the dawn. My days are swifter than a weaver's shuttle; they come to an end without hope. Remember that my life is like the wind; I shall not see happiness again.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 9:16-19, 22-23

Brothers and sisters: I preach the gospel, this is no reason for me to boast, for an obligation has been imposed on me, and woe to me if I do not preach it! If I do so willingly, I have recompense, but if unwillingly, then I have been entrusted with a stewardship. What then is my recompense? That, when I preach, I offer the gospel free of charge so as not to make full use of my right in the gospel. Although I am free in regard to all, I have made myself a slave to all so as to win over as many as possible. To the weak I became weak, to win over the weak. I have become all things to all, to save at least some. All this I do for the sake of the gospel, so that I too may have a share in it.

Gospel - Mark 1:29-39

On leaving the synagogue Jesus entered the house of Simon and Andrew with James and John. Simon's mother-in-law lay sick with a fever. They immediately told him about her. He approached, grasped her hand, and helped her up. Then the fever left her and she waited on them. When it was evening, after sunset, they brought to him all who were ill or possessed by demons. The whole town was gathered at the door. He cured many who were sick with various diseases, and he drove out many demons, not permitting them to speak because they knew him. Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed. Simon and those who were with him pursued him and on finding him said, "Everyone is looking for you." He told them, "Let us go to the nearby villages that I may preach there also. For this purpose have I come." So he went into their synagogues, preaching and driving out demons throughout the whole of Galilee.
