This little guy was so excited that weekend. I couldn't wait for Monday afternoon. It would be close to the



dinner hour when I would finally know. I can still feel the excitement. Our first color television was acquired sometime around 1970. Just prior to that,

I can remember my father pulling me out of bed late one night and making me watch "history" as he called it. My mother held me in her arms and stroked my head. The first lunar landing occurred in my black and white world of 1969. That world was now ending. More precisely, it would be totally



transformed. Our first color television was a big expense for us, but especially for a young boy, the cost was well worth it. A superhero that I had known, I would now know even better. The program finally began and in a mere instant I knew. I knew



what color *Ultraman* was. Even my black and white dreams of the *Beta Capsule* carrying menace to monsters would turn to color. Today in our flat screen

world of ever higher definition TV's, color is taken for granted. Although we live in a world filled with vibrant color, it seems too many folks see only in a black and white sort of way. Color is an interesting thing. Although perceiving color is not uniquely human, it is only human beings that give meaning to colors. There meanings can prompt all kinds of emotion or even a fierce loyalty. For instance,

I have noticed lots of green and white jerseys all about town these days for some reason. All of us tend to love red, white, and blue - but especially on the 4^{th} of July. It is green, of course, that represents our current liturgical season, though soon enough we'll see violet again with its requisite fasting and prayer. It was my most wonderful kindergarten teacher that taught me not to reduce people to a mere color. She helped me to see the vibrancy and full spectrum of color in every person. Color offers hope to humanity.

Jesus is the Light of the World and as we now know, thanks to a rather colorful fellow by the name of Sir Isaac Newton, light is but a whole assortment of colors. Notice that it is the



rainbow that appears in Scripture representing God, Faith, and Covenant. To know of colors and their vibrancy is to know of God, Himself. In our world today, despite so much bad news, violence, war, division, and seeming lack of Faith, I take heart at every traffic light. People of every stripe throughout the whole world, regardless of nationality, political persuasion, or favorite sports team, stop on

red and go on green. Amazing! Color unites all of us. What's more is that the universal truth of "red light/green light" is something that is taught – and learned. That has yet to change in a world where so many things are questioned or redefined.

Therein is our hope. If folks still know to stop or go at a traffic light depending on its color, even more so, the Truth of the One that brings Light and hence, Color to our world can be taught and known. Strive to shine this Light in our world and be excited, because then you'll be a full color superhero too!
