ADMINISTRATOR'S COLUMN

On the liturgical calendar, the Seasons of Advent and Christmas have come to an end, and we've returned to the calm of Ordinary Time. On the other hand, on my personal calendar, things seem anything but calm. Every year, it's the same thing. I defer things until "after the holidays," and come January, it all catches up to me very quickly. The good thing is it means there's a sense of accomplishment as things get done, but it does seem like every time I cross something off the list, three more things get added.

One of the big "to-do's" on the list for January was to look at the parish's plan for Lent, especially since we're looking at another Lent marked by Covid restrictions. Believe it or not, by the time you're reading this, Ash Wednesday will only be a month away. It's not too early to start planning for Lent. The full schedule of events and opportunities will be coming soon, so stay tuned.

I do want to mention one item now, however, so you can mark your calendars. The Feast Day of our parish patron, St. Gabriel of the Sorrowful Mother, is on Saturday, February 27. To honor our patron, there will be a Mass that morning at 9:00 am. We will also pay special honor to St. Gabriel at the Saturday evening and Sunday morning Mass that weekend. I'd love to have some kind of parish social that weekend to celebrate, but that doesn't seem feasible under the current restrictions – but it gives us something to hope for in the future, doesn't it?

Preparing to celebrate his feast day will be a good opportunity to do a little more studying.

READINGS FOR SUNDAY, JANUARY 17

First Reading - 1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19

Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the LORD, where the ark of God was. The LORD called to Samuel, who answered, "Here I am." Samuel ran to Eli and said, "Here I am. You called me." "I did not call you," Eli said. "Go back to sleep." So he went back to sleep. Again the LORD called Samuel, who rose and went to Eli. "Here I am," he said. "You called me." But Eli answered, "I did not call you, my son. Go back to sleep." At that time Samuel was not familiar with the LORD, because the LORD had not revealed anything to him as yet. The LORD called Samuel again, for the third time. Getting up and going to Eli, he said, "Here I am. You called me." Then Eli understood that the LORD was calling the youth. So he said to Samuel, "Go to sleep, and if you are called, reply, Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening." When Samuel went to sleep in his place, the LORD came and revealed his presence, calling out as before, "Samuel, Samuel!" Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Samuel grew up, and the LORD was with him, not permitting any word of his to be without effect.

Second Reading - 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20

Brothers and sisters: The body is not for immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord is for the body; God raised the Lord and will also raise us by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? But whoever is joined to the Lord becomes one Spirit with him. Avoid immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the immoral person sins against his own body. Do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God, and that you are not your own? For you have been purchased at a price. Therefore glorify God in your body.

Gospel - John 1:35-42

John was standing with two of his disciples, and as he watched Jesus walk by, he said, "Behold, the Lamb of God." The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, "What are you looking for?" They said to him, "Rabbi" – which translated means Teacher –, " where are you staying?" He said to them, "Come, and you will see." So they went and saw where Jesus was staying, and they stayed with him that day. It was about four in the afternoon. Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter, was one of the two who heard John and followed Jesus. He first found his own brother Simon and told him, "We have found the Messiah" – which is translated Christ. Then he brought him to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, "You are Simon the son of John; you will be called Cephas" – which is translated Peter.
