

Although I've never had the privilege of being called "dad," I do have the honor of being called "father." For

this honor, I'm ever so grateful. "Dads" today it seems, have a most difficult job. There are so many different tasks and responsibilities that are requisite. It can seem



impossible. If a top university were to somehow offer a course in "fatherhood," no one would be able to complete the vast curriculum anyway. This is just as true of priestly "fatherhood" also. Notice the seminary offers studies leading not to "fatherhood" but rather, to ordination and "priesthood." One of the many fond



memories that I have of my own father is something rather simple and

innocent. There really isn't much of a story behind it. Oh, I suppose it would happen more often around this time of year with the long days, warm weather, and the beginning of summer. It would be around the four



o'clock hour during the week and I would be outside with the neighborhood kids playing in the driveway next to our house. We played tag; we played ball; we

played superheroes; we played all kinds of things. That would all stop for me for a few brief moments during that four o'clock hour. That was the hour that my father got home from work. I would spot him sauntering down from the corner where carpooling



co-workers just dropped him off and I would run. Man, would I run. He would then drop whatever he was carrying and crouch over as I leapt up in his arms. He

hugged me and asked me how my day was. He reminded me that it was almost dinner time and to make sure that I took time to get washed up. Of dinner I never needed a reminder, the washing up part on the other hand... Throughout his life, my father never seemed to tire of those embraces – though the leaping part, of



course, did stop. Maybe herein is a message for all "fathers" priestly and otherwise...those with just one child – or those with many. Being a truly good father in today's world *is* difficult no doubt, but the key is in the heart. The key perhaps is having a shepherd's heart – in having *the* Shepherd's Heart, which in reality is having the Heart of a Good Father.



Good fathers like Good Shepherds keep watch over their tender flock. They're never too tired for an embrace even though they've been up since five in the morning.

Carrying a staff of sorts, sometimes they pull and sometimes they prod – making sure one really does wash up before dinner. I'm grateful for the gift of my own dad and I'm grateful for the gift of fatherhood. I hope that you are too! This is the day to take that running leap embracing dad and fatherhood – and make sure that you *really* do wash up for dinner! Happy Father's Day!
