I can distinctly remember having "the talk" with my father. He didn't initiate it. I did. I noticed some changes in myself that alarmed me. So, I asked my father if I could talk with him about something. He said, "Of course!" Since this was a rather private matter about "guy stuff," I led him into my bedroom and away from



the woman in the house - my mother. I thoroughly explained to my father what my concern was so as to be sure that he fully understood. His words to me were gentle and reassuring - and honestly, quite the relief. I was normal and this was all a part of growing-up. Whew! I thought something was wrong

for sure! What I didn't notice then, in my innocence, I can recall now with the benefit of years as I look back upon that day. Yes, my father's words did greatly reassure me, but

what I didn't see back then was his radiance. He was radiant with pride as his boy was becoming a man. He was even more radiant about the absolute trust and confidence that a son placed in his father. I had never been more my father's son than in that moment. After his gentle explanation of things that I, admittedly, did not fully





understand nor was fully aware, he told me to remember that I could always talk to him about anything - *anything*, he said again for emphasis - no matter how great or small or seemingly embarrassing it may seem. And in that moment, with these words, this man was never more fully my father. The trust and confidence

that I had in my earthly father is reflective of the trust and the confidence that all of us are to have in our heavenly One. God the Father wants us to be able to talk with Him about anything - *anything*. Our trust in Him is the very Pride of God that we know more

properly as His Glory. All good earthly fathers reflect this. How sad and traumatic it is, indeed, when such trust is betrayed. On Father's Day, we honor our fathers both living and deceased. It is a time for all fathers living to renew their efforts at being good fathers and reflecting God the Father as best they can. For us, their sons and daughters, it is a time to renew trust and confidence in the person that we call "Dad." I am grateful for the good relationship that I had (and still have) with my father. We continue to have "our talks," except now, they don't take place privately



in the bedroom, but quite publicly at the altar. He continues to reassure me, as does God the Father, about things I, admittedly, really do not fully understand nor am fully aware, but that are simply all part of "growing-up" in the Faith. *Thanks, Dad!* And thank God! It *is* good to know that we can talk about anything - *anything* - with Our Father! Happy Father's Day
