Amidst the violence and war-mongering of the times in which we live, as we engage our own Lenten penitential battles, perhaps now is a moment to seek some solace. We turn to the one to whom children always turn in times of pain, sorrow, and distress. We turn to our Mother. We turn to Mary. Our Mother, like all mothers, is always waiting and



ready to console us. This Third Week of Lent is an especially good moment to do so. This Friday is her Feast of Annunciation. The Angel Gabriel speaks to her and nine months later, she will give birth to a Son - a Joyful Mystery indeed. Our church is home to a most unusual portrayal of our Blessed Mother. The large painting in the back of church above the confessional room shows Mother and Child. Portrayals of Mary and the Child Jesus throughout Church history are common enough. There are usually artistic indicators such as halos, a gold sphere around the head, a child with the face of an adult, and somewhere the

color blue that has come to be associated with the Mother of God. There are none of these indicators in our portrait, but that is not what makes it unusual (although is the Mother's outer garment perhaps a very dark blue? Back in the early 1980's, Frank Strunk (a local banker) received a call from Mary Merritt. Mary and her husband Robert, were avid

art dealers. Mary requested permission to store some valuable artwork temporarily in the vault of Mr. Strunk's bank. In gratitude, since he would take no remuneration himself, the Merritts decided to donate a religious painting to Mr. Strunk's church in his honor in February 1984. As one of our parishioners has so correctly written, "this just goes to show us all that sometimes the greatest gifts come from the smallest actions of assistance and they can live on for years and years for the benefit of many people." The kindness of Mr. Strunk and the Merritts benefit us all, beautify our church, and make our church unique. Our Saint Gabriel image of Mother and Child is unique and outstanding because of the action it portrays. Yet, how natural and how beautiful! It is an intimacy that only a Mother Most Blessed could know! Over the centuries, it has been discretion that had been the artistic rule when it come to this Mother and Child. Our portrayal breaks the rule. Maybe we should as well. For far too long



perhaps, we have been oh so discreet when it comes to our prayers and our Church. We have been too discreet with our Catholic Faith. If we are going to win our Lenten battles, defeat violence, and make peace present in our world, then we are going to have to renew the intimacy that True Faith requires. Our most beautiful and unique painting in our church can remind us of just that. It shows a Mother lovingly and intimately feeding her Son. The reality is that it is He, Who most intimately and lovingly feeds us. That is what Eucharist is all about and that is what makes for true and lasting Peace!

Stations of the Cross: Wednesdays, March 23, 30, April 6, 13 at 1:00 PM. Fridays, March 25, April 1, 8 at 7:00 PM.

Fast & Abstinence: All persons who are 14 years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on all the Fridays of Lent (with the exception of Friday, March 25, which is the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord) and Good Friday. Further, All persons 18 years of age and older, up to and including their 59th birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Good Friday, while the other two meals are to light. All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily; to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance; to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures; and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended. All our encouraged to participate in Operation Rice Bowl which has aided countless hungry persons here in the Archdiocese as well as throughout our nation and our world.
