Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Soon our Archdiocese will take up the Annual Collection for the Church in Latin America. For more than 50 years, this collection has been a way for Catholics in the United States to unite more closely with our brothers and sisters in faith throughout Latin America and the Caribbean. Funds generated from this initiative support diocesan pastoral catechetical and family life ministries, seminary studies, and formation programs for religious sisters and brothers. This collection also helps the poorest dioceses obtain basic necessities that they would not be able to afford otherwise. Without your help they would not be able to meet the pastoral and temporal needs of those who count on them.

At the far eastern end of the island of Cuba, the priests in the Diocese of Guantánamo-Baracoa traverse bad roads over rough terrain to bring the sacraments and the Word of God to the faithful living in that remote region. The mountainous territory that makes up 75% of the diocese's total land area makes travel not only difficult but also more expensive for priests due to higher fuel consumption, vehicle maintenance, and repair costs when compared to other regions.

Catholics like you who generously contribute to the Collection for the Church in Latin America help Guantánamo-Baracoa's priests stay on the road with funds given to the diocese to offset fuel and vehicle repair costs. In places such as Cuba, you help bring the Good News to the poor when you participate in the collection.

Our Archdiocese will take up this Collection the weekend of March 12 and 13, 2023. Please be generous and take this opportunity to share your faith with the families of Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support will truly make a difference. Thank you and God bless you.

#### **FAST & ABSTINENCE AND OTHER ACTS OF PENANCE**

FOR LENT: The Bishops of the United States prescribe, as minimal obligation, that all persons who are fourteen years of age and older are bound to abstain from eating meat on Ash Wednesday, on all the Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Further, all persons eighteen years of age and older, up to and including their fifty-ninth birthday, are bound to fast by limiting themselves to a single full meal on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, while the other two meals on those days are to be light.

All the faithful are encouraged, when possible, to participate at Mass and to receive the Holy Eucharist daily, to celebrate frequently the Sacrament of Penance, to undertake spiritual reading, especially the study of the Sacred Scriptures, and to participate in parish Lenten devotions as well as Lenten education programs. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is especially recommended.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** Wednesdays, March 8, 15, 22, 29 and April 5 at 1:00 PM. Fridays, March 10, 17, 24 and 31 at 7:00 PM.

**CONFESSIONS:** Wednesdays, March 8, 15, 22, 29 and April 5 from 12:30 PM to 1:00 PM. Saturdays, March 11, 18 and 25 from 3:00 PM to 3:45 PM.

ADORATION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT: Wednesdays, March 8, 15, 22, 29 and April 5 from 9:30 AM to 1:00 PM and 1:30 PM to 5:00 PM. Benediction at 5:00 PM.

Recently, some of my brother priests and I gathered with our Archbishop for lunch. The meal and the conversation were informal. There was no particular agenda. In the midst of downing our burgers and fries the talk turned to healthy eating. Cue the irony. It wasn't really

our burgers and fries, the talk turned to healthy eating. Cue the irony. It wasn't really that "healthy eating" per se came up in the midst of our lunchtime chat, but rather "healthy lifestyle" in general. A "healthy lifestyle" in priests fosters healthy parishes, healthy parishioners, and a healthy church. Archbishop Pérez noted that health can sometimes be overlooked or simply taken for granted. It can be like the basics of life, he said, that we so often take for granted such as food, water, or air. It was the air




and our vital need for it that caused him to relate something about himself that I didn't know and that I found rather interesting. I don't know a whole lot about scuba diving, but the Archbishop does. He's a diver, though he acknowledged that he engages in it a lot less now than in times past. I suppose the Schuylkill doesn't readily lend itself to this activity. He began relating some technical details about diving and divers beginning with the need for proper equipment and certainly a full tank of air. It is the air that is so critical.

One needs to be ever aware of it and just how much or how little one has. One's life depends on it. Divers are acutely aware of this. In these days of Lent, all of us




are called to heighten our awareness of the "air" that is so vital for parish life and the life of the Church. As we pray, reflect upon God's Word, and come before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament, we are immersed anew in That which is truly vital for Life. Together then, we can share techniques, hone our skills and learn to use "proper equipment" enjoying more and more the "sport" of our
