a world altering pandemic remains yet little understood. There followed, for many, an election in doubt. There were dubious claims of a mailed-in majority. Yet, daring such doubt could have had one detained as a troublemaker of the domestic sort. Today, one national border is all but forgotten, while another has the attention of the entire world focused upon it. Sadly, it is replete with scapegoat, villain, and violence. Of course, innocent in all of this are now we who go forth into Lent. What have we learned? I suppose Adam and his wife felt just as innocent as they went forth from the Garden beginning their Lent and that of the whole world. Wearing but fig leaves, they must have shivered

in the cool winds of March that year long before history marked time. Had they but questioned, things might have been different. Had they but learned, things definitely would be. Tempted they followed. Doubts muted they fell – and so, too, the world. The paper has been folded up. Lent is a time for us to once again pause, question, and learn. It is the annual "refresher course" in which we discern the Truth anew amidst the often unfortunate current events of our times; to allow ourselves to be taught anew by the One, Who came to teach us. Lent is a time to open ourselves anew to the Knowledge that Jesus alone can impart. Today we don't open the paper



so much as a web browser, but the learning so necessary is the same. Open yourself anew this Lent to learn the Truth that is our Faith. It's time to have our fill. See you in the kitchen!
