The little guy squirmed out of the front pew in which he had been sitting next to mom and dad. It was



a long ceremony for sure, but being up front, he had an unobstructed view of all that was going on. His eyes were now fixed on his much older brother. As his brother, older I image by some eighteen or so years, now lay down on the floor, the little guy decided that he should do the same. He kind of balled up on the floor with head turned keeping an eye on big brother who would soon also be known as Father. This was the image captured in a photo and shown as a slide at the beginning of the keynote address at the recent convocation of archdiocesan priests. *Fathers, this is priesthood* said the speaker, a clergyman

from another diocese. It was a poignant image that must have especially resonated for those present that were siblings. There are a number of those in the archdiocese. However, the image and the words spoken resonated for all. *This is priesthood*. It is one, whose call began not with words, but with example, a curiosity peaked, and perhaps an uncomfortable pew during a long ceremony. All priesthood is like this. All priests can cite those who gave example: the "big brother" upon whom the eyes were fixed. It could have been a particular pope, pastor, parochial vicar, or even one's pain-in-

the-neck brother. There was always the example. I remember that no-quitebut-soon-to-be ordained priest (otherwise known as a transitional deacon) that visited my sixth grade classroom when I was in school. I have no recollection whatsoever of what he said that day, but unbeknownst to him, he planted a seed that would take root and grow. Jesus planted seeds in exactly this way...except that He knew. With one seed already taking root, it was Andrew that hurried to find his brother. *Come and see!*, he said. Peter would come. He would see and he would be profoundly moved by the example. A miraculous abundance of fish caught in the sea would lead to a very unique and special



seed being planted in the soil of Peter's heart. Jesus continues to sow such seeds. This weekend six men were ordained priests for the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. They all have stories to tell of example given and seeds sown. The speaker at our convocation said something else that I've never heard. He noted how religious communities have their founders. For example, Jesuits might boast that they were founded by St. Ignatius of Loyola, while the Passionist Community of our own Saint Gabriel was founded by St. Paul of the Cross. The "community" that is know as the Diocesan Priesthood has a founder as well, he said. That founder is none other than Saint Peter, himself – the first diocesan priest! Example begets example and seeds sown lead to ever more plants, fruit, seeds, abundance, and a whole New Way that is, in a word, exemplary. Pray for priests. Pray for those whose roots have just taken hold and those whose roots have seen many a season. Pray that all of us together might set the good example that cannot be overlooked so that from among us there will be those who "come and see" as seeds are planted and take root! *This is priesthood*!
