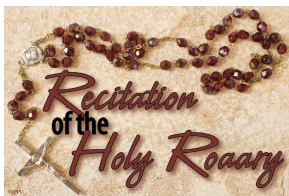

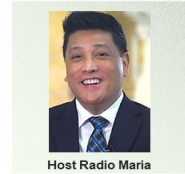

Wow! It's Memorial Day already...or as many would say...*finally*! On Memorial Day, we remember all of our service personnel, but especially those that have given their lives in service to our

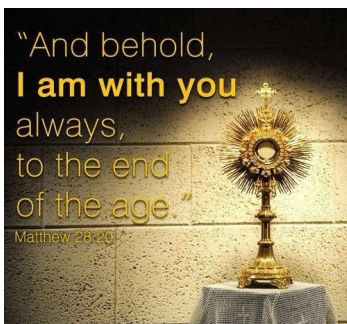
