



She was lying there distressed in the shadows on the floor of the rectory chapel. There was damage. There



was injury. Turning on the light revealed a woman unhinged. Mary, it seems, fell right off the wall. Could she have jumped? Could not her Savior Son have intervened? All I know is that the wooden wall-mounted image of the Blessed Mother was now indeed on the floor - and broken. Mounting adhesive tape had given way. Attempted repair was in order. This weekend



concludes Vocation Awareness Week in the Archdiocese. Part of the awareness that I have experienced in my vocation is that, for me, it often involves fixing that which is broken. This awareness began in the seminary when a broken statue of the Blessed Mother hidden above the drop ceiling

of my dorm room quite literally revealed itself as an unusual gust of wind coming through the window caused the ceiling panel to become ajar. As a priest there have been many repairs of this, that, and the other thing

beginning as soon as I was ordained. The list includes of course, light fixtures and toilets, but also boilers and sound systems. Priests are called upon to attempt to fix many things, but sacred images are the most interesting and ultimately the most important. Not too long ago, it was the Little Flower that took a fall. Knocked from her pedestal she shattered on the ground. Though severely damaged, she would come to be replaced by the figure of a saintly pope as now John Paul II stands in her stead. And needless to say, the replacing of the beloved, but well worn, Blessed Mother statue of our parish was quite the undertaking, but now we have a most beautiful grotto in which to pray and meditate. Part of a priest's work is indeed fixing things broken, but his most



important work is restoring the Broken Image. In all the repairs of the various things that I've been called upon to make, I have had to call upon the assistance of others. Believe it or not, I did not study plumbing or auditory technologies in the seminary! But maybe such courses would have helped! Even with the courses that I did take, I still need assistance. It is the Lord Himself Who definitively restores the Broken Image in each one of us. This is the real work and vocation of a priest and in this sense, the priest is merely *His* assistant. There's a gusty wind blowing in our world today revealing many Broken Images. Priests have much work to do! All of us do! Consider your call as one who repairs that which is broken. Consider your call in restoring the very Image of Christ in our world!
