ADMINISTRATOR'S COLUMN

Last Sunday, I spoke about how our parish was responding to the uptick in cases of Covid. Since repetition is the mother of learning, I wanted to reiterate a few things in this space. As always in this situation, things are changing rapidly, and because of print deadlines, it's always possible that what gets printed here will have changed by the time you see it, but there isn't much we can do about that.

We're doing what we can as a parish to ensure the health and safety of our parishioners. The church building is cleaned and sanitized regularly. We've done our best to avoid having shared materials, e.g. hymnals. We're using more instrumental music instead of singing since there are concerns about increased transmission when people sing. Confessions are heard in the cry room where there is a greater opportunity for distancing. PREP is following all guidance and directives.

But while we are doing what we can as an institution, we need you, as individuals to do your part as well: wearing masks, using hand sanitizer, not socializing in the building after Mass, keeping adequate spacing, etc. As I mentioned last week, this is especially important in the Communion Procession. When you come up to receive Holy Communion, please be sure you maintain spacing with the person in front of you and keep your mask on. You should remove your mask as you approach the priest or minister of Communion – before extending your hands to receive – and then replace your mask as soon as you have consumed the Sacred Host and start back to your pew.

Starting next weekend, we will be including the text of the readings for Sunday Mass in the bulletin and will have the bulletin available for you as you enter the church, so that those who like to follow along with the readings will have that opportunity. However, if you take a bulletin as you enter the church, please take it with you when you leave. This isn't just for sanitation purposes, but also to help keep the church looking nice. Also, no reading the rest of the bulletin during the homily – no matter how boring the priest is!

We begin Advent and a new liturgical year next week. Don't forget that our confession schedule changes a bit on Saturday – we'll now have them starting at 3:00. We'll be publishing the full schedule for Advent and Christmas soon.

Finally, Happy Thanksgiving to all of you and your families. With all the chaos and uncertainty this year has brought, it is still important for us to take the time to thank God for all the blessings we do have. Whatever your celebration may look like this year, be sure to express your gratitude and be mindful of those who may not be able to enjoy all the good things you do. Be safe, and enjoy the holiday.
