

The Corner

I'm not really one for visiting cemeteries. There's a reason for that. For me, it is when I am celebrating Mass that I am closest with my loved ones that have died and gone before me in Faith. This is especially true concerning my parents.



I can feel their presence. I mean, I can really feel their presence. It's hard for me to explain, but it's true. They are there with me – beside me at the altar and I see them in the Host that I hold aloft. In a sense, it doesn't get any better except for when I see them again (God willing) in Heaven. Cemeteries, however, exist for a reason. They are more than simply places to inter a loved one's physical remains. Many people find comfort and

consolation there. Standing and praying at the grave of a

parent, spouse, friend, or family member can help suture the wound that is the pain of loss. Knowing that their physical remains are buried there can help us to feel close to them in a way similar that a saint's relic helps us to feel closer to that canonized individual. I had need and desire to visit a cemetery not too long ago. Although, I've prayed for Michael at Mass and certainly know that he too, is present whenever I celebrate the Sacred Liturgy, I was not able to attend Michael's funeral. My young friend died suddenly at thirty-five in Southern



Germany where he lived. I remember the moment his brother contacted me. It was hard for me to hold back the tears at the Wawa where I was gassing up my car. When I traveled in September, I knew I would not only have to visit Mike's brother, parents, and his wife, Bettina, but I would also have to visit Michael himself. I made this fact known to them and it was Michael's father who immediately said, I'll take you. I had need for closure that sometimes only a cemetery



visit can bring. It was a most beautiful day and the cemetery was a rather short drive. The walled burial grounds lay immediately behind a rather quaint little Bavarian church. It was this church from which my friend was buried. His father parked the car and led me onto the grounds opening the wrought iron gate. We walked passed rows of headstones to the very back. There in the corner, right next to a lovely little tree was Michael. A wooden cross

marked the spot, since the final headstone (a slab actually) was not yet ready. I motioned with my hand blessing the grave and saying a little prayer. I looked up and beyond the cemetery wall to see a vast field ringed by trees in the distance. I breathed in the smell of summer, nature, and life. I could feel a suturing taking place within. Then I heard the silent weeping of the man standing next to me. His suturing would take a good deal longer. I



dabbed my eyes too, as I placed my hand on his shoulder. After a long pause, we silently made our way back to the car.



A sense of healing and hope had taken root, but would need time to grow. Part of that growth will take place – I'm rather certain – with the birth of Mike's second child which should take place any moment now as I write this. The joy of a newborn! I can't wait till I get word. In the meantime, I'm praying. I'm praying for Bettina and her newborn. I'm praying for grandma, but

I'm especially praying for grandpa that a newborn child might bring him peace, much like that newborn Child of Peace born so many centuries ago in Bethlehem.

November is the Month of Holy Souls. On the evening of the 14th, we will have a special Memorial Mass remembering all our deceased loved ones, but especially those that have died during this past year. Mike will be there with me. I'll be praying for him, his wife, his firstborn, his newborn, brother, mother, and especially



for his father. I hope that you'll join me bringing your own prayers for loved ones, for healing, and for peace. And may all the souls of the faithful departed, through the Mercy of God, rest in Peace! Amen!
