



Communion. It's rather touching and kind of cool when the youngest one goes off to college. I suppose it's kind of cool also to have an "uncle" that's a priest, especially when the college newly attended happens to be a Catholic one. The text message (always a text message) arrived just the other day with the pre-Labor Day start of the semester. Hey Uncle Gene! It's Maggie! I am taking a Catholic Theology course and I have some work to do for it...If I need help can I call you later hahaha... By "call" she meant "text." Of course! And Good




Luck at school! I'm such a wonderful priest and uncle. Besides, I too need to do some penance. Soon enough, the texts and questions began. What is the connection or relationship between Dei Verbum's understanding of revelation and Macquarrie's

presentation of theology? It was actually quite the pleasant distraction and I was immediately transported back to my seminary days. This type of question – and there were several like it – cause college students and seminarians as well quite a bit of angst. However,




as a priest with a bit of experience under my belt, I dove right in. The theologian in me began to parse the questions and seek the answer making use of the technology that's right at our finger tips. The teacher in me knew enough not to simply give an answer, but to lead her to one so that she might begin to discover the answer – the greater Answer – for herself. *Dei Verbum* is the Second Vatican Council's Constitution on Divine Revelation. It recognized Christ as the Sole Mediator between God and Man – and that He is the fullness of God's revelation of Himself. The document also recognized Sacred



Scripture and Tradition as originating in that Divine Revelation through the Sole Mediator.

Wow! Heavy stuff! Macquarrie, it seems, was an Anglican priest and theologian who threw some shade on the "sole" mediator thing. Apparently, he was open to others – though JC was number one for him. Ah...no. There is but One Sole Mediator and "revealer" of God. I conveyed this to Maggie (yes, via text) in the hope that not only would she be able



to hand in a paper and get an "A" - but again, that she would be able to "connect the dots" and begin to see and know the answer herself - to know the One Who is the

Answer to all questions. This is what Jesus Himself did. Countless times the disciples and others came to Jesus with questions. They just wanted an answer so that they could hand in their assignment. What Jesus gave was insight. Often He told parables or gave answers opposite of what everyone thought that the answer should be. Of course,



then why ask the question to begin with unless one is trying to trick and trap and otherwise cause one to fail the course? Jesus wanted His followers to discover that He is the Answer. He wants us to discover that too. And that's what I want Maggie to discover as well, because such a discovery results in an eternal degree that's Summa Cum Laude – and pretty darn cool as well!
