

Father Joseph will soon be returning to his home Diocese of Byumba in Rwanda. It's been a pleasure having him here at Saint Gabe's and I believe that all of us have been enriched by his presence. He'll also be returning to his students and



the start of a new school year. I can't imagine what it must be like to be the principal of a five hundred plus student **boarding** school! At the end of a long, very hot, central Africa day, it's not a matter of sending the students home. They **are** home! I'll be praying for you, Father! As Father Joseph has brought just a little bit of Africa to us here in Stowe, I hope that when he returns home, that he is able to bring just a little bit of Stowe to Byumba – aside from the vestments that we're giving him! One of the many things that I've enjoyed in my priesthood over the years is having had opportunities to meet brother priests from other dioceses and other parts of the world. I've certainly met many Vietnamese priests, including a visiting bishop. This all began with my having Vietnamese friends in the seminary. Although a little hesitant at first with this friendly

"foreigner," they wound up taking me into their inner circle, giving me a Vietnamese nickname, and always inviting me to their "illegal" dorm room "noodle parties." This is where I first encountered the Vietnamese food that I love. Over the years,

there have been plenty of missionary priest visitors that were present for a weekend. One missionary priest was a bishop. It was a wonderful couple of days spent with the former Philadelphia priest and then bishop of the Virgin Islands, Herbert Bevard. He had oh so many stories to tell. One year, I took part in an international priests' retreat. I was the lone priest representing the Archdiocese. I roomed with priests from the Archdiocese of New York and an



Anglican British cleric who, rather interestingly, was also on the retreat. I recall going to Confession to a French priest that spoke English. It took place in the middle of a beautiful field on a brilliantly sunny day in Southern France. I'll never forget his kindness. Then, there was the time that I was on retreat in a Benedictine monastery in Germany. It was from



this monastery that the first Benedictine monks came to America arriving at Latrobe, Pennsylvania in 1832. While on retreat, I met a retired archbishop that was living there. He insisted on sitting next to me at table during the times that we were permitted to talk and offered great words of encouragement. It was the Abbot, Wolfgang Maria Hagl, OSB, that served as my retreat director at the time and he too, was a blessing for me with his words and hospitality. Just today, I was sent a picture of my little nephew, Erich, beginning his first day of school. The first year students customarily receive a special blessing at church. Giving the blessing is the priest friend whose church I celebrate Mass in when I'm

vacationing. I'm grateful for his long time hospitality. I miss the delightful meals and conversations had with him and his now deceased mother. There have been priests of other nations and nationalities that I have met as well. The priestly journey, if nothing else, is one of friendship and fraternity.

Jesus said to His disciples, *I have called you friends*. All of us are called to this by virtue of our Baptism, but priests are called to this in a special way by virtue of their Ordination. I'm happy to be able to call Father Joseph a brother priest and friend. He should know that he



always has a room in my house and he has already told me that I always have a room in his for when (not **if**) I come to Byumba. I just hope that he doesn't leave me in charge of his students that **never** go home! Safe travels, Father! Thank you for bringing just a little bit of Africa to us!
