In school, my classmates and I often had to complete book reports on books read. The other boys read books on baseball or football, while I read books on golf and golf legends. Did you know that Arnold Palmer was from Latrobe in Western Pennsylvania? He was my dad's hero and my father was a loyal member of "Arnie's Army." I'm not sure that I ever had a favorite player. There were many greats: Jack "the Golden Bear" Nicklaus, Johnny Miller, Tom Watson, Lee Trevino, Gary Player, Sam Snead, and of course, Chi Chi Rodriquez. Although I may not have had a favorite player, I did have a favorite club. The pitching wedge is a fun club and yet, it can be used to get out of some tough situations. One might say that it's a club for life in general. I love to be able to pop the ball right up and over a tall tree if needed. I even remember learning about the different types of golf balls. There was the Top-Flite, Surlyn, hard-cover ball for going long from the tee and then there was the very soft balata cover of Titleist which gave incredible backspin on the green. Golf for me was a great sport and a great hobby. I'm so glad for all those times that I was out on the course with my father. It helped me to get through school with my book reports and through life with the patience learned whenever I was having an "off" day on the course.
