Math is not my forte. I shared that from the pulpit recently. Whereas Saint Peter was probably pretty decent at




arithmetic as an angler running a lucrative fishing business, my mathematical acumen in grade school was bleeding red and headed for bankruptcy. I blame it on the "new way" of learning math that was introduced at the time—as if the "old way" wasn't good enough. "IPI" stood for "individually prescribed instruction." The idea was that everyone learns at a different pace in general and so with IPI, students can learn mathematical concepts at their own pace in



particular. Some would advance more quickly and others – like me – would need a little more time...except that time would eventually run out. It became apparent that quite a number of students were lagging in their math skills and in my eighth grade year, we had a "cram course" of some three years worth of math and its concepts. I was spooked to say the least. It had to be some Ivy League wunderkind that came up with IPI or, at least, some person not actually involved in teaching math to young minds in grade school. I don't really blame the school administration. Innovation is supposed to be good, right? Often it's been noted tongue-in-cheek that if you were taught

by "Mac" nuns (IHM's) in elementary school, boy did you learn your math and if you were taught by "the Josies," (SSJ's) then you had grammar and writing skills par excellence. I can skillfully diagram a sentence to this day. Just don't ask me to figure out a square root. I shared my plight



the other day with someone that I hadn't seen for a while. She well understood, retired math teacher that she is. She recalled that many of her students either were or became fearful of math. They felt that they simply couldn't grasp the concepts. This is a fundamental mistake, she said. She helped her students not only to grasp concepts, but to actually enjoy math. This is something that eludes me to this day...unless I'm writing about it. This



former math teacher's role was actually more one of simple encouragement...and when the "light hulb went on" in the student's head, any darkness concerning math vanished rather quickly

"light bulb went on" in the student's head, any darkness concerning math vanished rather quickly. Her story made me call to mind another "math story" of my own. I was in high school at the time still struggling and trying to grasp many of the mathematical concepts. I was still "spooked" by math. I was very surprised then, when I was asked to tutor

someone in math. *Me? You're kidding, right?* A co-worker of my father had a daughter in grade school that was really struggling with math. He wanted to know if perhaps I could give her a little tutoring. He would even offer a little remuneration. I gave it my best shot. The little girl was very sweet and attentive. I would ask a little about her school day and she would always offer me some of the candy that was her after-school snack. I felt that my efforts were rather futile. For the most part, I simply helped her complete her homework and offered her encouragement saying that if I could figure out the equation, anybody could. Sometimes I helped her with her other homework as well. That school year ended and I was happy to hear that she passed her end-of-the-year math exam. In fact, she passed all of her exams. She wouldn't have to repeat a grade. That sweet little





girl grew into a fine young lady that excelled in math. She would major in it at college and wind up being a leader in the field of

pharmaceutical science. I take just a little pride in the small part that I played in her success. All it took was a little encouragement from a guy who didn't feel very encouraged concerning his own math prowess. Encouragement is the key. All of us are called to be

tutors, especially when it comes to our Faith. When we encourage one another, we grow in courage too even if, at times, we've failed to grasp some of "the concepts" in the past ourselves.
